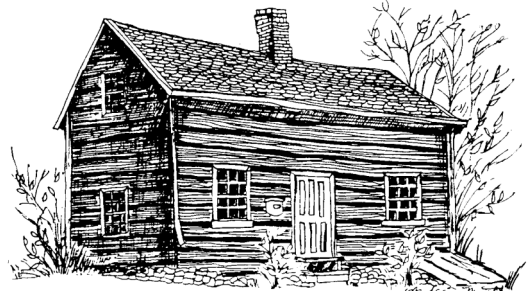

### *Annual Fall Meeting*

A crowd of 60 people attended our Annual Meeting in November. President Dave Totten reported our "Year in Review". The membership elected five board members to fill expiring terms. Two of these, Cheryl Schober and Rip Edmundson, replace long time board members Al Mueller and Roy Meidenbauer, who chose "retirement". Following the meeting, Rochelle Pennington presented "A Christmas Miracle". This phenomenon is celebrated in Europe but is not well known here as it happened in 1914 and the US was not officially in the war yet. It is considered "the most extraordinary event in military history." 100,000 enemy combatants stopped the war for one day and "met in the middle" on Christmas Eve, singing carols and exchanging gifts. Rochelle presented original photos of soldiers from both sides with lit Christmas trees. She also displayed artifact items that were sent to the soldiers for Christmas. A very heartening story enjoyed by all.

### *Volunteer Party*

Thirty-five volunteers and guests enjoyed a buffet supper at Kat's Café during the holiday season. The food was good and visiting enjoyable. Kat's has been good to us for years, providing coffee for all of our Open Houses.

### *Christmas Time at the Park*

The houses were all lit with candles in the windows and lighted Christmas trees in their parlors. This year we had lighted wreaths on all of the new lamp posts lining the walkways. John Martin's Angels again put up a decorated tree in the Gazebo. The cabin is all wrapped up like a present until Spring – too bad we couldn't put a ribbon around it like a gift!



### *Tuesday Workday Activity*

When the weather cooperates, volunteers gather at the Museum. This winter 160 books were sorted and indexed, recorded and marked for computer input. The large backlog of acquisitions was photographed, recorded, and boxed up until they are ready to be put on display this Spring. The office space and lower storage area was cleaned. The barrel train is being repaired and painted. The file collection is getting new folders.

### *Swartz Family Donation*

The Swartz family in Cecil, WI donated a large granite stepping stone that was used by their family to get in and out of carriages. Bob Meyer, Peter Swartz's grandson, volunteered to go up to Cecil and bring the stone down to the Park. We can't thank him enough for doing that. This summer you will see the "stone" in front of the Museum next to a wagon to demonstrate how it was used. If you look closely you will see the name "Swartz" inscribed on the stone.

**Spring Meeting**

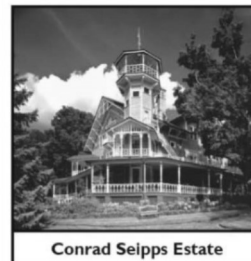
