Museum News

Last year, a Museum Planning Committee was established to develop a plan for use of the new and former space. With board approval, the committee engaged a consultant who completed a Master Plan with input from committee members. The plan included reconfigured existing exhibits and new exhibits.

In a few weeks, we expect the museum addition to be complete and the little blue building will vanish from the scene. The society anticipates beginning the move back into the new and refurbished space in mid-November.

Further tweaking and updating is to be expected as we implement the plan over the next several years. The Society is in need of additional volunteer help for this project.

Tractors and Truck Donations

The board has voted to accept several larger artifacts from donors now that new museum space will be available. These include three tractors and implements from Herb Cooper and a stake body truck from Harvey Rindt. These artifacts are all relevant to the mid-century era of New Berlin agriculture.
