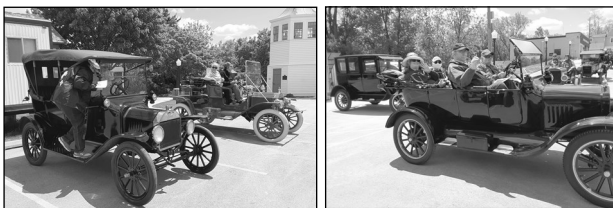


## Tours

## Museum News

In conjunction with the museum’s expansion project, construction workers removed the front façade panels, revealing the buildings former identity.



The only automobile dealer in New Berlin, Prospect Hill Motors sold Studebaker vehicles from 1959-1964. The sign would date from about the time the Avanti (listed to the right of Hawk, but missing the “I”) was introduced in April, 1982. The exotic, 120 mph, Avanti sports car was said to be the fastest production vehicle available. We have been told the dealer was required to install a dynamometer and test every Avanti sold to verify it could reach the advertised speed. The building housed fire station #3 after it was purchased by the city in 1965.



With the framing and sheathing completed for the museum addition, horizontal siding will next be installed to integrate new and old.
